



PROJECTS IMPLEMENTED BY WOMEN



Agroforestry in the Zielawa Valley

The project entitled 'Innovative model for the production, processing and distribution of herbs in the Zielawa Valley' is being implemented under the 'Cooperation' measure of the RDP 2014-2020 on the farm of Dr Barbara Baj Wójtowicz in Sosnówka, Lubelskie Voivodeship. The aim of the project is to develop and implement a comprehensive new model of cultivation, harvesting, farm management and processing through a new system, and a model that will result in two final new products marketed through an improved marketing method. The project was developed by Dr Barbara Baj Wójtowicz working for Oxford University, founder of the world's only agroforestry plantation with cloudberries on a farm in Sosnówka; and Professor Ewa Osińska researcher at the Warsaw University of Life Sciences and promoter of Poland's first doctorate in agroforestry and specialist in herbaceous crops. Agroforestry has been hailed by the UN as the most important innovation for agriculture in the coming years. Read more



2 Ojcowski trout

"Pstrag Ojcowski" is a family project carried out by mother and daughter Magdalena Węgiel and Agnieszka Sendor, who decided to restore the splendour of the ponds located in the heart of Ojców National Park in Małopolskie Voivodeship. Their aim is to restore brook trout farming, promote conscious and ethical breeding, educate the community about the history of the region and culinary traditions. The women have won the title of Innovative Women Farmers of the European Union, and their Ojcowski Trout was included on the ministerial list of traditional products from Małopolska. It also belongs to the Małopolska Culinary Heritage Network. Less than a month after starting up the farm, it was awarded a prize at the "Regionalia" fair in Warsaw. The natural, traditional way of smoking using beech smoke with a slight touch of fruit wood gives the dish a unique character. The Minister of Agriculture and Rural Development, the Marshal of the Malopolska Region and the Polish Chamber of Regional and Local Product honoured it with an award in the category: Treasures of Nature. 3 Angelic Gardens

"Anielskie Ogrody" is a project to create a small family organic farm from scratch with a beautiful home garden, run by Kamila and Bogdan Kasperski in the Lubuskie region. The farm produces organic vegetables, fruit, herbs and flowers for the family and the local community. The added value of the project is practical, multimedia ecological education on a national scale, both in the form of workshops and using the Internet. The community gardens for pre-school and school children and the elderly provide inspiration and motivation for local communities. The Polish project not only made it to the finals of the Rural Inspiration Awards 2021 organised by the European Network for Rural Development (ENRD), it also won the Popular Vote. Read more

Emilia Sznajder's kingdom of pickles

Vegetable farm, Dolnoślaskie Voivodship

The Sznajder silage farm is a place where people with real passion and tradition operate. Pickling has been going on without interruption for 60 years, that is 3 generations. Mrs Emilia loves pickling and has it in her genes. She uses crop rotation so that cabbage in a given field is not grown more than once every four years. The reason? In her experience, the pests that love cabbage can survive in the soil for up to three years while waiting for new vegetables. What is the secret to good pickling? And what is cucumber airplane? Agnieszka Wierzbicka-Baxter from the plum valley

Fruit farm in Szydłów, Świętokrzyskie Voivodeship



Raised in an orchard since childhood, she spent several years abroad where she fulfilled herself professionally. When she returned to Poland, she saw her hometown of Szydłów with different eyes - the incredible wealth of Szydłów, set among hilly hectares with its natural wealth of plums. She couldn't believe that nobody was doing anything about it here. She started producing a unique local product on the farm - the Szydłów plum. The Szydłów valley has a unique microclimate, clean soil, air and water. Every year, buyers emphasise that the Szydłów plum has a firm light-coloured flesh and is prettier and tastier than in other regions. The fame and taste of the Szydłowska plum has also reached many European countries. Śliwka Szydłowska has been awarded the Protected Geographical Indication certificate and the Product Po mark. More

Janina Rzepka - Woman at a shepherd's hut First woman in Poland to become a certified shepherd, Małopolskie Voivodeship



The first female shepherd to boast a certificate authorising her to practise this unique profession. In season, she works with her family, from dawn until late in the evening. And she starts this season when the snow melts. Her shepherd's hut stands by the road from Bukowina Tatrzańska to Łysa Polana. She also runs a guesthouse, which is looked after by her daughters. They also take orders for certified oscypek, redykołka and bryndza Podhale cheeses. Ms Janina also organises demonstrations and workshops in the production of traditional regional products. More

Elisabeth Cipora and a vineyard on a plot of land A vineyard on a plot of land and the "Spod hebelka" Museum, Lubuskie Voivodeship



In Trzebiechów, there is a small home winery run by Elżbieta and her husband. She began her adventure with viticulture twelve years ago. It took a long time to "compose" the vineyard, learn the difficult and demanding craft and produce the noble beverage. Today, she and her husband primarily cultivate dessert varietals that fit in with the terrain and climatic conditions. Their vineyard brings the family together and attracts friends. For the past six years, they have been organising the "Art on the Vineyard" event in June, which attracts many artists. Five years ago, the "Spod hebelka" workshop was established on the vineyard grounds. It is a real manufactory of unique, one-of-a-kind serving boards, bowls, spoons, hearts and small toys.
